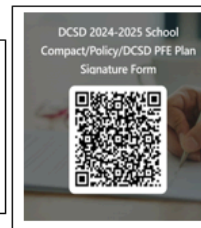

What is Title I?

Tapestry Public Charter School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

What is the Parent and Family Engagement Policy?

This is a policy that describes how our school will provide opportunities to improve parent and family engagement that will support student learning at school and at home. **Tapestry Public Charter** values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Tapestry will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.
